Kalbarri Foreshore

Meet the pelicans at 8.45 each morning as they make their way to the grassed area where they are fed. There's a fabulous kids nature playground with picnic tables and cafes and nearby.

Blue Holes Beach

The thriving marine life makes for spectacular snorkelling, with inter-tidal and protected areas make it a great place to swim too. Just south of town.

Chinaman's Beach

Clear tranquil waters near the mouth of the Murchison River.

Jacque's Point

Superb left-hand break, renowned surf spot.

Coastal Cliffs

Be sure to check out Natural Bridge and Island Rock, Pot Alley, Eagle Gorge and the Bigurda Trail.

World Class Fishing

Great beach fishing, offshore fishing and crayfishing charters (including catch and keep) and estuary fishing make Kalbarri a fisher's paradise. Watch regular weigh-ins at the pub by the local angling club.

Quad Biking and Beach Buggy Tours

Enjoy breathtaking views of the ocean, cliffs and whales (in season) and the excitement of driving your own quad-bike or beach buggy to remote locations.

Many Ways to Get Around

Electric bikes, river party pontoon (no skippers ticket required), boat hire, SUP, paddle boats, kayaks, canoes and more...

Foodie and Seafoodie Heaven

There is lots to choose from! Fresh local seafood & family dining options are available at local restaurants, cafes, pubs, bakeries as well as Asian & Italian takeaway.

Whale Watching

Join a whale watching tour and look for humpback whale mothers with calves from June to October or spot them from the many vantage points along the coast.

Wildflowers

From July to October, thousands of species of wildflower bloom. Best locations are the National Parks, particularly the gorges and coastal cliffs.

Kalbarri Skywalk

A thrilling walk out along two cantilevered viewing platforms that hang in mid-air 100 metres above the gorge in the Kalbarri National Park with spectacular views of the Murchison River.

Z-Bend Lookout and Trails

Breathtaking views of Z-Bend Gorge and river. Also the start of the 6km 4-ways walk trail with ladder climbs and steep decent to access the river.

Guided Tours

Go to out of the way places to experience crayfishing first hand and sample your catch, for spectacular sightseeing, hiking, canoeing, gorge swimming and star-gazing. Adventure tours include abseiling and canoe safaris. And if you want a bird's eye view of all that Kalbarri has to offer in the same day, take a scenic flight.

Park Rules

Please observe the following to ensure safety and comfort for all our guests.

WiFi access

Please note – WIFI access cannot be guaranteed and varies in strength across the Park. Signal is often best near the Camp Kitchen and the main Ablutions.

Check-Out Time is 10am for accommodation and sites

Arrival, Departure and During Your Stay

- Reception hours are generally 9am to 6pm daily but please check for seasonal variations.
- Checkout is 10am for sites and all accommodation (villas, cabins, units).
- Please enquire at the office the day before your departure if you are seeking a late check-out. This is not guaranteed and may involve an additional charge.
- Extensions of your stay (extra night/s) are subject to availability – please ask us early on in your stay, we will do our best to assist.
- The speed limit is strictly walking pace (5km per hour) throughout the Park. This includes bicycles.
- Children must be supervised at all times by an adult, especially in the pool, TV room, ablutions and playground.
- Children must wear helmets when riding bikes and scooters in the Park.
- Kangaroo alert! Kangaroos often come into the Park in the evening and parents are urged to supervise children – they can be dangerous. Please don't attempt to feed them and don't approach or provoke them.
- Visitors are not permitted to use Park facilities (eg pool, playground, BBQs, laundry etc) unless with the permission of Park Management. Visitors may not bring vehicles into the Park.
- All visitors should depart by 9pm.

Site Set Up

- Draw bars must face the road. Your vehicle is to be contained within your site and not cause obstruction to roadways or other guests.
- Please ensure your caravan/camper trailer and any other structures on your site (eg annex or awning) are no less than 1.5 meters inside every boundary of your site.
- Do not put pegs through the shade cloth on sites that provide mats.
- Do not place wipes, tissues, fat, food scraps or any bulky material down intake drains. This results in blockages and inconvenience for you and others.
- Fires of any sort are not permitted, use only approved BBQs. Please keep sites clean and tidy at all times.
- If you do not have a waste water connection from your caravan to an intake drain, a bucket must be used to collect waste water and emptied regularly.
- Tarps should not be placed on the ground. Please use shade cloth or an approved matting.
- One vehicle per site is allowed. Please ask at Reception for additional parking. Boat parking is subject to availability and cannot be guaranteed.
- Use the power source allocated for your site and a compliant power cord that is in good condition. Drawing too much power will trip out your power supply - if this occurs you will need to unplug appliances to reduce your draw.

Park Facilities and Equipment

- The pool opens at approximately 9am and closes at dusk. There is no lifeguard on duty, children must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times. Please observe the Pool Rules signage in the pool area which includes no alcohol, food, glass, smoking/vaping, running, rough play.
- Children should not use playground equipment before 7.30am or after dusk. Parents must supervise children. Alcohol, glass, smoking/vaping and rough play are not permitted in or around the Playground.

- Drinking water is provided from all taps and should be conserved. Ablution and accommodation showers all use fresh water. Please do not fill your water tanks with Park water. (See below for water fill locations).
- Washing machines and dryers take gold coins, ask at Reception if change is required (noting if the machine you intend to use requires \$1 or \$2 coins). Please ensure you empty the machines as soon as finished and don't leave clothes on the clothesline for longer than necessary.
- A chemical toilet dump point is located next to the Laundry.
- Our Campers Kitchen has cooking equipment, microwaves, refrigeration, dish washing facilities and outdoor covered seating. Please leave this clean and tidy for others.
- Use of gas BBQs is free, please ensure you share the BBQs if necessary, and leave the plate clean for the next user.
- Gas bottles can be refilled at certain times of the day – please ask at Reception.
- Fish cleaning is not permitted in the Park. Please use the facilities provided along the foreshore and dispose of fish waste there, do not put fish waste in our bins.
- Our power supply is limited, particularly at certain times. Do not charge your electric vehicle using Park power as it may cause system outage. There is an EV charging station outside the Kalbarri Visitor Centre and down at the foreshore next to the IGA carpark.

Dump Point and Fresh Water Supply

The Shire of Northampton provides a fresh water tap and dump point less than five minutes away at the Shire Depot, located on Porter Street in the Light Industrial Area.

Let's Be Environmentally Responsible

Our local authority does not offer a recycling service but there are things we can do to be more environmentally responsible. Please;

- Separate your rubbish – at bin stations along the main entry road, separate your waste onto general waste, recyclable containers and cardboard.
- Take home your bulk cardboard and packaging – recycle at home to save it going to landfill. Please don't clutter our bin areas with packaging.
- Place your recyclable containers in the crates provided - the local Rotary Club regularly collects recyclable containers to support local projects, be a part of supporting the Kalbarri community.

Please conserve power and water

Don't leave air conditioners on when you go out. All taps and showers are potable water, please use wisely.
